Report of the Board of Trustees

For the year ended 31 December 2017

The Board of Trustees present their annual report for the year ended 31 December 2017, together with the audited financial statements for the year which are also prepared to meet the requirements for a directors' report and financial statements for Companies Act purposes.

The financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, Companies Act 2006, the Memorandum and Articles of Association, and Accounting and Reporting for Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102).

Purpose and activities

Charitable purposes

These are:

- The promotion of any charitable purposes for the benefit of the community in the county of Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly and in particular the advancement of education, the protection of good health, both mental and physical and the relief of poverty and sickness.
- Other exclusively charitable purposes in the United Kingdom and elsewhere which are in the opinion of the trustees beneficial to the community including those in the area of benefit.

Public benefit, aims and objectives

The charity complies with the public benefit requirement through its grant making programmes.

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning future activities and setting the grant making policy each year.

The grant making programmes are wholly directed at supporting community groups within Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly.

The charity's fund development work is aimed at ensuring the funds continue to be available in the future so that income can be generated to continue to support the above groups for the benefit of the residents in the county.

Strategic report

Review of achievements and plans for the future (incorporating Chairman's Report)

I am delighted to report that the Foundation had another successful year and awarded £575,669 to 417 community projects in Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly. We couldn't have achieved this without the support from our wonderful friends, business supporters and fund holders.

At the end of 2017 the total funds held and managed in the Foundation's endowment was £4,715,784 (an increase of £942,473 in a year) and assets totalled £5,632,659 (an increase of £962,374). New endowed funds included The Karenza Fund to improve care and enhance education for children and young people with special needs or disability in Cornwall and The Trewithen Fund to support disadvantaged young people through mentoring.

Our largest funds by the amount awarded were the '#iwill campaign' (£55,000), Goonhilly Wind Farm (£38,149), Manor Solar Farm (£37,346), Social Action Fund (£31,193) and Comic Relief (£28,069).

In 2017 the Foundation was appointed once again by The Duke of Cornwall's Benevolent Fund to award £25,000 to support young carers and £20,000 to support the work of the Crisis Fund of which £10,000 will be ringfenced to support projects with the transition to Universal Credit. The Lord Lieutenant's Fund for Youth awarded £ 17,678 to gifted young people.

The new '#iwill campaign' – Youth Social Action, a joint commitment by the UK Government and Big Lottery Fund, allowed us to award more than £50,000 to Cornish youth projects. The programme supports projects that engage young people through community involvement to develop additional skills that are life-changing.

In partnership with Cornwall Rural Community Charity we were once again awarded a tender by Cornwall Council. We awarded £25,272 social care grants through the Wellbeing and Prevention programme to local voluntary and community organisations to enhance the quality of life for those with care and support needs through developing a range of activities and events.

The Cornwall Club initiative for people living away from Cornwall who still want to help Cornish causes helped to raise more funds through our Second Home Owner Scheme and a new membership scheme. Funds from the Cornwall Club supported people in hardship through our Crisis and Social Action Funds. The Cornwall Community Land Trust also received £8,959 to help with building genuinely affordable homes for local people.

Our business club, the Cornwall 100 Club, awarded a total of £26,231 to 13 community projects in 2017. Last year we started to host networking breakfasts for our business supporters where they were able to meet representatives from projects that they had supported. We also nurtured relationships with professional advisors and hosted workshops to stimulate philanthropy.

Many of our business supporters helped us beyond their membership fees. St Austell Brewery supported our events with drinks and Savills and Foot Anstey sponsored our London event. Goonvean Holdings Ltd supported our new Philanthropy Director position with a generous £25,000 donation in 2017.

We are very grateful to the Garfield Weston Foundation who enabled us to create the Philanthropy Director position by agreeing to match fund the new post for three years.

Last year we commissioned a research called Vital Signs to improve our understanding of the changing social needs in Cornwall. The report highlighted that deprivation and rural isolation are the two biggest issues facing Cornwall. Vital Signs helps to improve our grant awarding services and inspire philanthropy. We wouldn't have been able to commission the research without James Williams DL Trustee's kind donation.

Sadly we had to bid final farewell to two former Trustees of the Foundation, Lady Mary Holborow DCVO and Lady George. Their dedication to Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly will remain an inspiration for all of us.

I would like to say a heartfelt thank you to The Hon. Evelyn Boscawen DL for his dedication as Chairman. He stepped down as Chairman of the Foundation in 2017. I also deeply appreciate the work of Oliver Baines OBE, Chief Executive, who retired in March. Tamas Haydu has been appointed as the new Chief Executive, Jeremy Ward joined our dedicated team as Development Director and Joanna Riley as Philanthropy Director.

Our team had the opportunity to participate in UK Community Foundations' biennial conference in Cardiff. Community Foundations across the UK have collectively distributed one billion pounds to local charities to date. Last year our Foundation's governance, operation procedures, financial management and principles were inspected once again by an independent assessor and we were awarded a Quality Accreditation by UKCF.

As always our aim is to strengthen communities by promoting effective philanthropy. We believe grassroots organisations hold the key to improving the lives of the most disadvantaged.

I would like to thank on behalf of the trustees, the tireless work carried out by our supporters, volunteers, friends, donors, fund holders, and our team in the Launceston office. I am truly grateful to my fellow trustees for generously giving their time to support the work of the Foundation.

I very much look forward to building on our successes in 2018.

Financial review

The total income for the year was £1,541,918 (2016: £1,218,340). Total expenditure was £853,643 (2016: £870,769), giving net incoming movement in funds for the year of £962,374 (2016: incoming £648,577) after investment gains of £274,099 (2016: £301,006).

At the year-end total charity funds were £5,632,659 (2016: £4,670,285). This consisted of endowment funds of £4,715,784 (2016: £3,773,311), restricted funds of £678,210 (2016: £681,151) and unrestricted funds of £238,665 (2016: £215,823).

Investment powers and policy

Under the Memorandum and Articles of Association, the charity has the power to make any investments which the trustees see fit. The trustees regularly review internal financial information to ensure their financial position is such that it is adequate to provide sufficient resources to perform the charity's objects in all types of conditions and to act accordingly. The Trustees have reflected on the need to balance risk and return on its reserves and have decided to maintain a balance between equity investments and interest bearing accounts.

Grant making policy

The charity considers applications for funding support on a regular basis. Applications are reviewed against specific criteria and the amount granted is based on available funds.

Reserves policy

It is the trustees' view that it is prudent to accumulate free reserves to be able to cover anticipated administration costs to sustain its operations, during any period when income generating activities may temporarily cease. The trustees therefore consider that reserves should be held to finance at least nine months of budgeted operating costs which is approximately £180,000. At the year end the general fund was £202,903 (2016: £175,834). The level of reserves held is closely monitored by the trustees.

Structure, Governance and Management

The Foundation is constituted as a company limited by guarantee and was incorporated on 1 July 2003 and registered as a charity on 10 October 2003. The charity is administered by a board of trustees which meets a minimum of three times a year. A Chief Executive who is not a trustee is appointed by the board to manage the day-to-day operations of the charity.

Recruitment and induction of trustees

Suitable candidates are selected by the existing trustees and invited to become trustees. New trustees are inducted into the workings of the charity.

Pay policy for senior staff

The pay of the senior staff is reviewed annually. In view of the nature of the charity, the directors benchmark against pay levels in other similar organisations.

Related parties

None of the trustees receive remuneration or other benefit from their work with the charity.

Any connection between a trustee or senior staff member with a grant recipient or supplier of the charity is disclosed to the board of Trustees in the same way as any other contractual relationship with a related party.

In the current year no such related party transactions were reported.

Risk assessment

The trustees have assessed the principal risks and uncertainties to which the charity is exposed and have established systems to mitigate those risks. The principal financial risk is a loss of income through falling donations and investment performance. This is monitored to ensure expenditure is kept within the funds available. This is an ongoing procedure and is subject to regular review.

A risk assessment is carried out annually as part of the CCF's Quality Assurance accreditation, covering all aspects of the charity's activities and scored according to probability and impact. Remedial measure are taken where required.

Auditors

A resolution proposing that Robinson Reed Layton LLP be reappointed as auditors will be put to the Annual General Meeting.

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

Notes

(forming part of the financial statements)

1 General information

The company is incorporated as a company limited by guarantee and does not have share capital. In the event of the company being wound up each member is liable to contribute a sum not exceeding £1 towards the debts and liabilities of the company and the costs, charges and expenses of winding up. There were 15 members at 31 December 2017 (2016: 16).

2 Summary of significant accounting policies

2.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their financial statements in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (effective 1 January 2015) – (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) and the Companies Act 2006.

Cornwall Community Foundation meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy note. The financial statements are prepared in Sterling which is the functional currency of the charity and rounded to the nearest \mathfrak{L} .

2.2 Income

Incoming resources including grants receivable are accounted for in the period in which the charitable company is entitled to receipt.

No amount is included in the financial statements for volunteers' time in line with the SORP (FRS102).

2.3 Bequests and legacies

A legacy or bequest is recognised in the financial statements when the certainty of receipt and the amount receivable has been established.

2.4 Expenditure

Expenditure is included on an accruals basis. The irrecoverable element of VAT is included with the item of expense to which it relates.

Certain expenditure is directly attributable to specific activities and has been included in those cost categories. Other costs, which are attributable to more than one activity, are apportioned across cost categories on the basis of an estimate of the proportion of time spent by staff on those activities.

Grants payable are charged in the period when the offer is conveyed to the recipient except in those cases where the offer is conditional, such grants being recognised as expenditure when the conditions attaching are fulfilled. Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the period end are noted as a commitment, but not accrued as expenditure.

2.5 Unrestricted and designated funds

These funds have been made available to the trustees without specific conditions. The use of unrestricted funds is entirely at the discretion of the trustees. Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular purposes.

2.6 Restricted funds

These funds are made available to the trustees with specific conditions imposed by the donors as to the nature of their use.

2.7 Endowment funds

These include a permanent endowment fund which is to be held permanently and only the income from it is used for charitable activities. Expendable endowment funds are primarily held to provide income but the trustees also have the option to spend the fund capital on charitable activities.

2.8 Transfers

Transfers are made when appropriate from a specific fund to recover costs incurred not charged directly to that fund.

2.9 Taxation

The company is an exempt charity within the meaning of schedule 3 of the Charities Act 2011 and is considered to pass the test set out in Paragraph 1 Schedule 6 Finance Act 2010 and therefore it meets the definition of a charitable company for UK corporation tax purposes.

2.10 Employee benefits

When employees have rendered service to the charity, short-term employee benefits to which the employees are entitled are recognised at the undiscounted amount expected to be paid in exchange for that service.

The charity operates a defined contribution pension plan for the benefit of its employees. Contributions are expensed as they become payable.

2.11 Fixed asset investments

Investments are stated in the financial statements at fair/market value. Unrealised gains on investments are calculated by reference to the difference between fair/market value from one year to the next. Realised gains or losses are calculated by reference to the difference between proceeds of sale and the carrying value of the investment at the previous year end.

2.12 Debtors and creditors

Debtors receivable and creditors payable within one year are recorded at transaction price.

2.13 Operating leases

Rental charges are charged in the statement of financial activities on a straight line basis over the life of the lease.
